Background

In 2015, Secura Insurance, based out of Neenah, Wisconsin opened up an onsite clinic for its associates and families to have better access to healthcare. When the clinic first opened, it was focused on providing acute care, but recently has transitioned into a full health and wellness facility focused on caring for the whole person.

The clinic provides a variety of expanded services that includes annual wellness visits, chronic disease management, primary and acute care, rehabilitation and preventive therapy services.

Secura has a state-of-the-art facility, complete with a walking/running track, basketball court, fitness room and health classes. The clinic staff is completely integrated with the onsite amenities and makes seamless referrals for employees that can benefit from the services.

Staffing & Hours of Operation

The onsite health and wellness center is open Monday – Friday with staggered hours for flexibility and access for the 1,300 eligible associates and dependents. Onsite staff includes:

- NP: 18 hours/week
- RN: 26 hours/week
- PT: 36 hours/week
